FOR WATER

Every day, 292 million people around the world walk 30 minutes or more to collect water. Will you walk in solidarity with them this Lent, and raise funds to help bring clean, safe drinking water to vulnerable communities?



Schools

BIG WATER WALK

Unite your school community and hold a one-day walking event during Lent, around your oval, local park or around school grounds. Your walk, and every dollar you raise, will create lasting change and bring clean, safe water to communities around the world.

GIVE IT UP FOR LENT

Top Fundraising Tips!

TIP 1

Personalise your fundraising page

Give your fundraising page a personal touch with a selfie and share updates about why you're passionate about taking part in Project Compassion this year.



TIP 2

Donate to your own page

Lead the way for others! Donate to your own fundraising page to show your commitment and get your fundraising off to the best start possible.



TIP 3

Create and grow your team

Reach out and ask others to join your fundraising team! Project Compassion is more fun when you unite with others.



TIP 4

Ask everywhere. Ask often

Let people know about your fundraiser every chance you get. Share updates on socials and group chats and put up posters in your workplace, school or parish.



TIP 5

Chat to local business owners

See if shops and local businesses can help with donations – they could even donate goods and services that you can raffle off to raise funds.



TIP 6

Host a fundraising event

How ever you take part in Project Compassion this Lent, you can make it even better with a fundraising event. Host a morning tea, movie night or anything you like! Ask people to donate to attend your event.



TIP 7

Thank your supporters

Be generous with your shout-outs! Keep the positivity flowing, publicly and privately thank those who donate.

Your support gives clean water to students like Toefuata'iga



SAMOA

The funds you'll raise as part of Project Compassion can bring clean drinking water and improved hygiene to communities around the world.

Toefuata'iga, (Toy-foo-ah-tah-ing-ah) a 13-year-old primary school student in Samoa, faced severe challenges and disruptions to her learning due to water scarcity. After Caritas Australia's partner Caritas Samoa installed a 10,000 litre water tank at her school, Toefuata'iga and her classmates saw improved health, consistent attendance, and more opportunities to prioritise education.



Can provide hand sanitiser to increase health and hygiene.



Can provide hygiene training for a whole community.



Can provide water tank maintenance training, so a community can have sustainable access to clean water.



Can provide a 5,000 L water tank for access to clean drinking water.

VIETNAM

Lam faced limited career prospects due to his disability. Thanks to incredible Project Compassion fundraisers like you, he was able to further his education and pursue his passions. Now, Lam runs a successful graphic design business.



Can provide disability screenings, early intervention advice and procedures to 5 children.



Can support start-up livelihood opportunities for youth and women with disabilities.



Can support people or children with disabilities with equipment like wheelchairs and hearing aids.



Can provide community-based vocational training that suits the needs of youth and women with disabilities.
